



Changes to the collection of voluntary authorisation for organ or tissue donation

It has been almost a year since the latest revision of the GPR form (GMSGPR001) was published. It removed the necessity to collect patient's preferences following the changes in Organ Donation law in Scotland.

Despite the new GPR form being in place we are continuing to see an unexpectedly high number of transactions of a patient's Organ Donation preferences from GP Practices via PARTNERS to CHI and onward to NHS Blood & Transplant (NHSBT).

We would be grateful if all GP Practices could ensure that you are hosting the latest GPR on your website and you destroy any locally held copies so the collection of patient authorisation for organ donation is stopped. You can find the latest version of the GPR form here:

COVID Vaccination Records

A number of queries have been raised relating to the difficulty in obtaining exact figures for the number of manual updates for inclusion in the COVID form.

In these instances practices should make their nearest approximation based on their experience of having managed the downloads and associated amendments.

Once we have the finalised figures, a reconciliation will be carried out and if further information is required to validate the figures we will reach out to the practice for assistance.

COVID Funding

The COVID funding first issued in April 2020, against which practices have been submitting claims, is due to end as of the 31st March 2022. Any practice who still has a balance of the original funding remaining will have this reclaimed in early 2022-23 once the Health Boards have provided the finalised position for practices. If your practice still has outstanding receipts you should forward these to the board for validation and subsequent payment prior to 31st March 2022 after which date they will no longer be able to accept.

GP Annual Certificate of Pensionable Profits (GAC)
